DENNY HULME

Denny Hulme, 33-year-old New Zealander and 1967 World Driving Champion, is one of international motor racing's brightest new stars.

In 1965 and 1966, he drove Sid Taylor's Lola-Chevy to new sports car records on almost all of the major English circuits.

Driving a Formula 1 Repco-Brabham as teammate of world champion Jack Brabham of Australia, Hulme in 1967 won the Grand Prix at Monaco and the German Grand Prix at Nurburgring to rack up the points to capture the World Driving Championship.

In his first try in the Indianapolis 500, in 1967, Hulme finished fourth and was named Rookie-of-the-Year.

Denny teamed with Bruce McLaren in the 1967 Canadian-American Challenge Cup Series, and drove a new monocoque McLaren-Chevy to second place in the series standings behind McLaren.

Hulme is married and now lives in London, England.
