ALL-AMERICAN RACERS, INC.

All-American Racers, Inc., Santa Ana, Calif., is the company which builds Dan Gurney's Indianapolis and Grand Prix Eagle racing cars.

In just three years of car building, AAR has become one of the most successful and best-known race car manufacturers in the world, turning out more than 20 Indianapolis type Eagles for customers, as well as the exotic metal Grand Prix cars for its own racing purposes.

In addition to the 18,000 sq. ft. facility which employs 25 highly-skilled craftsmen in California, there is an overseas branch, Anglo-American Racers, in Ashford, England, which serves as a base for the company's Grand Prix racing.

More than 90 per cent of all Eagle cars are designed, fabricated and assembled in the Santa Ana plant.

Gurney, who also races Can-Am sports cars, with engines incorporating his Gurney Eagle cylinder heads, is president and owner of the firm.

Among drivers who have piloted Eagles in this country and abroad are reigning world champion Dennis Hulme, former champion Phil Hill, Bruce McLaren, Roger McCluskey, Bobby Unser, A. J. Foyt, Lloyd Ruby, Jerry Grant, Ludivico Scarfiotti, Johnny Rutherford, and Jochen Rindt.

The 1968 Eagles which Gurney brings to the Indianapolis 500 are the first of his "second generation", marking a new departure in design and overall looks from the 1966-67 cars.
